

Ashbridges bay wastewater treatment plant

What's happening at the Ashbridges Bay treatment plant?

It's been a busy few years at the Ashbridges Bay Treatment Plant (ABTP) where the outfall is being upgraded to better handle storm surges and population growth demands, but the end is in sight. The ABTP is the second largest plant of its kind in Canada and one of the oldest, dating back to 1917 with the outfall constructed in 1947.

Where is Toronto's second largest wastewater treatment plant?

The City's second largest wastewater treatment plant, located at 130 The Queensway, near the mouth of the Humber River. Situated in the Don Valley at 21 Redway Road. Ashbridges Bay Treatment Plant Located at 9 Leslie Street in Toronto's east end, Ashbridges Bay is one of Canada's largest and oldest wastewater treatment plants.

What is the capacity of Ashbridges Bay treatment plant?

The Ashbridges Bay Treatment Plant has a rated capacity of 818,000 m³/day, or 818 ML/day. Major liquid treatment processes include screening and grit removal, primary treatment, secondary treatment, nutrient removal, and effluent disinfection.

Does Ashbridges Bay have a sewershed?

The plant sewershed includes combined sewers and subject to extremely high flows in wet weather. The City is undertaking significant works to capture and treat combined sewers flows and reduce the peak flows to Ashbridges Bay, enabling the plant to perform better.
