Prior to transportation, confirmation that there is no leakage and no spillage from a container is necessary. Cargo must be handled without falling, dropping or breakage. Care must be ...

Other battery types, such as alkaline or nickel-metal hydride (NiMH), are generally considered safer to ship. However, they still require proper packaging and handling to avoid damage ...

IATA has been contacted by various parties experiencing difficulties shipping and accepting Batteries, nickel metal hydride (UN 3496) and equipment containing them by air transport.

The battery must be protected against short circuits and securely packaged; The battery and outer packaging must be plainly and durably marked "NON- SPILLABLE" or "NON-SPILLABLE ...



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
