



Photovoltaic panels are not applicable to the area

It is not recommended for municipalities to use the Model Solar Energy Local Law "as is"; rather, it was created as a resource for advising local governments when adopting solar energy local laws.

Panels should be installed in locations that are least visible from streets and common areas and should consider screening to minimize visibility from neighbors.

The provisions of this section are applicable to a solar energy generating system in an intensely developed area, a limited development area, and a resource conservation area.

Solar photovoltaic panels supported by a structure with no potential use underneath shall not constitute an additional story or additional floor area and may exceed the height limit when constructed on a ...

NFPA 1 provides guidance on how solar photovoltaic panels must be installed on the roofs of homes.

The intent of solar energy ready requirements is to provide a penetration free and shade free portion of the roof, called the solar zone. This helps ensure future installation of a solar energy system is not ...

This allowance may vary by jurisdiction and is generally based on the assumption that solar PV panels will not be stepped on or used by anyone to support any live load.
